

Why Switzerland?

The headquarters of many international organizations are located, including the European headquarters of the United Nations, the World Health Organization, and the World Trade Organization. Switzerland is a world leader in terms of economic capacity and medical level, and has been in the process of innovation and development for a long time.

As a future international talent, proficient use of multiple languages is an important skill. Switzerland has a strong advantage in this regard. The official languages of Switzerland are French, German, Italian and Romansh.

Swiss boarding schools have a long and fine tradition, and teaching strictly follows international standards. Many royal families in Europe send their children to study in Switzerland, and swiss international boarding schools have also cultivated many leaders in today's society.

Why Altdorf?

Altdorf, the main town located in the rural Canton of Uri in Switzerland, is located near the Lake Lucerne. It is a historic town dating back to the origin of Switzerland, a main route in the center of Europe and an ideal starting point for excursions to the Uri vacation region, which has many attractive offerings. This little town has the world-famous monument to Willhem Tell, the hero of Switzerland's origin.

The mountains around the town, are famous as excursion destinations in summer as well as in winter. In winter the same mountains are wonderful for winter hikes and snowshoe tours, and with the magnificent views over the lake, the area is a scenic skiing experience for adults and children. In summer the canton becomes a hiking and bicycling paradise, with many Alpine farms inviting hikers to partake of food and drink with magnificent views. Finally, the area is and has been very safe for citizens, children, visitors and tourists, ensuring focus and relaxation for people of all ages.

Beautiful Setting



Typical Day - Monday to Friday


Our school residence are designed for students who are living and studying away from home. At International School Altdorf, they are fully supported by the boarding supervisors and by the teachers and staff, to feel welcome and taken care of, to fully benefit of the daily activities. Breakfast, lunch and dinner are served in the residence's dining room seven days a week.

During the week the day starts with class lessons throughout the morning, where each student follows the assigned timetable according to her / his year group, academic program, current and future interests. A mid-morning break allows a short moment of rest between the various lessons.



After lunch, class lessons resume until mid-afternoon, when clubs, sports and activities will be offered. At International School Altdorf we think that education is not limited to classroom lessons, thus every year a broader program of sports, clubs and activities will be offered, including also collaborations with local clubs and associations.

In the evening, students will enjoy free time for themselves and for group activities, a short session devoted to homework and preparation for the next school day.



Programs Pathways

At International School Altdorf, students enjoy great flexibility when it comes to choosing their courses. The main curricula offered are the International Baccalaureate Diploma Programme and the International Baccalaureate Career-related Programme, each lasting for two years during grades 11 and 12. These IB curricula, coupled with the internationalism of International School Altdorf, are the best preparation to continue the academic journey towards higher education.

The curriculum offered in Grades 8, 9 and 10, includes a variety of courses for learners with a wide range of abilities and interests, including those whose first language is not English. Our course offering is centered around eight groups of subjects, designed to encourage our students to engage with a variety of topics, with an emphasis on interdisciplinarity, research and inquiry – to learn how they all fit together. International School Altdorf's education centered around the philosophy International Baccalaureate philosophy, however students can choose to sit for the IGCSE exams and obtain the related qualifications.



School Facilities

Living Spaces

Students can choose to stay in a double or triple room, each one equipped with a private bathroom. Students living in the on-campus residence are looked after by boarding supervisors who ensure they have a caring adult to turn to. International School Altdorf students enjoy the strong sense of community that they feel by studying and living with their classmates.



Teachers & Staff Support

Students and staff enjoy many points of contact throughout the day. Our boarding supervisors, teachers, counselors and other on-campus staff look after our students 24/7. This can be in the classroom, during clubs and activities, and when students venture off-campus for chaperoned field trips or sports activities.



Laboratories

Newly renovated, the School laboratories facilities make it possible for every teacher to do frequent practical science safely. Each laboratory has sufficient equipment for students to work individually, in pairs and in small groups.





Outdoor Facilities

Programs

International Baccalaureate Diploma Programme (IBDP)



The IB Diploma Programme is an academically challenging and balanced programme of education with final examinations that prepares students, aged 16 to 19, for success at university and life beyond. It has been designed to address the intellectual, social, emotional and physical well-being and future success of students. The programme has gained recognition and respect from the world's leading universities, but also from employers around the world.

This programme is a life learning experience for any student. It allows them to challenge themselves not only academically but also personally. By taking part in the IB Diploma Programme, young learners discover new passions, develop skills that serve them throughout their lives, become self-aware and independent while experiencing the lifestyle of a new country.

The IB Diploma Programme offered by International School Altdorf encompasses these goals by aiming to develop inquiring, knowledgeable and caring young people who help to create a better and more peaceful world through intercultural understanding and respect. Our teaching and learning methods are one of our major assets to student success: by empowering and overpowering the students to achieve their academic goals and acquire many international languages permitting them to be effectively operational in a global and professional environment.

Bridge to Universities

The International Baccalaureate is an essential stepping stone for students who want to study further in the top universities of the world. The programme will prepare each pupil to an academic lifestyle by developing important skills related to workflow, independence and outstanding knowledge.

Academic Performance

The academic results of our graduating students have shown outstanding achievements and progression in the last years.

Our Class of 2020 International Baccalaureate (IB) Diploma Programme students scored well above the global IB average, registering an average of 35 out of a total of 45 points, with 94% of students obtaining a full bilingual diploma. The highest score achieved was 44 points.

Our Class of 2021 International Baccalaureate (IB) Diploma Programme students have scored well above the global IB average, registering an average of 36 out of a total of 45 points, with 100% of students obtaining their bilingual Diploma. The highest score achieved was 44 points and 38% of students achieved over 38 points.

Our Class of 2022 International Baccalaureate (IB) Diploma Programme students have scored above the global IB average, with 100% of students obtaining their Diploma, out of which 90% obtained a bilingual Diploma. The highest score achieved was 44 points.

IB DIPLOMA CURRICULUM

To earn an International Baccalaureate diploma, students must take courses from six subjects. One each from groups 1-5, and either one from group 6 or a substitute from one of the other groups.

Each student must take at least 3 subjects at Higher Level HL, and the remaining at Standard Level SL. Standard Level subjects take up 150 teaching hours, while Higher Level comprises 240 teaching hours.

We recognize that each student has different interests, which is why we offer a variety of options inside the classroom. This variety is also a key part of the programme, as assessments and teaching methods are tailored to allow young learners to take advantage of their individual skills

International Baccalaureate Career-related Programme (IBCP)



The IB Career-related Programme is a framework of international education that incorporates the values of the IB while addressing the needs of students willing to pursue a career-related education. It will thus prepare students for success in applied universities studies and professional activities.

In the IB Career Related Program, students aged 16 to 19 will undertake a minimum of two IB Diploma Programme courses and a set of career-related studies. The IB diploma courses provide the theoretical underpinning and academic rigor of the programme; the career-related studies further support the programme's academic strength while providing practical, real-world approaches to learning; and the Career- related core components will help students to develop skills and competencies required for immediate use in a professional environment as well as for lifelong learning. By taking part in the IB Career-related Programme, young learners become self-aware and independent while experiencing the lifestyle of a new country and developing intercultural understanding and respect.

The IB Career-related Programme offered by International School Altdorf will focus on academic pathways related to Languages, Business Administration, Finance and Accounting, and International Tourism Management. This flexible programme allows International School Altdorf to meet the needs of its high school students through courses assessed both internally by the school or by its academic partners and externally by international curriculum organizations. Our teaching and learning methods are one of our major assets to student success: by empowering and overpowering the students to achieve their academic goals and acquire many international languages permitting them to be effectively operational in a global and professional environment.

Bridge to Universities

The IB Career-related Programme is conceived around our existing academics for the IB Diploma Programme and is expanded through collaboration with professional partners, institutions and business schools to increase the focus on Business Administration, Finance and Accounting, and International Tourism Management.

Our Career-Related Academic Program partners are Bella Vista Institute for Higher Education (BVIS) and the United Nations World Tourism Organization (UNWTO) and its Academy, including its links to international professional associations and Member States.



IB CAREER-RELATED PROGRAMME CURRICULUM

To successfully complete the IB Career-related Programme, students must take at least two IB Diploma Programme courses at Standard Level (SL) and at least one career-related course. The programme is completed by four mandatory core components (Language Development, Service Learning, Personal and Professional Skills, Reflective Project).

Our career-related studies and courses are accredited by the UNWTO Academy and by OTHM, a British independent awarding institution regulated by Ofqual (the regulator of qualifications, examinations and assessments in England and Whales), and are delivered through a partnership with the Bella Vista Institute of Higher Education (BVIS).



Middle Years Programme

International School Altdorf is broadening its academic offering for the junior years, to accommodate the more diverse background of its international students and prepare them for the challenges they will face in their senior years towards graduation and later to university and the professional environment.

International School Altdorf is now a Candidate School* for the International Baccalaureate (IB) Middle Years Programme (MYP), as it is pursuing authorization for this programme as an IB World School. These are schools that share a common philosophy - a commitment to high quality, challenging, international education that International School Altdorf believes is important for our students.

*Only schools authorized by the IB Organization can offer any of its four academic programmes: the Primary Years Programme (PYP), the Middle Years Programme (MYP), the Diploma Programme (DP) or the Career-related Programme (CP). Candidate status gives no guarantee that authorization for a programme will be granted. For further information about the IB and its programmes, visit www.ibo.org.

Core Characteristics of the IB Middle Years Programme:

- Addresses holistically students' intellectual, social, emotional and physical well-being;
- Provides students opportunities to develop the knowledge, attitudes and skills they need in order to manage complexity and take responsible action for the future;
- Ensures breadth and depth of understanding through study in eight subject groups;
- Requires the study of at least two languages (language of instruction and additional language of choice) to support students in understanding their own cultures and those of others;
- Empowers students to participate in service within the community;
- Helps to prepare students for further education, the workplace and a lifetime of learning.

We are thus offering a diverse set of courses and activities as a comprehensive and balanced program for the junior years, organized to highlight conceptual understanding, reasoning, critical thinking and interdisciplinary connections.

This approach will address the needs of our students aged 14 to 16 years and develop active learners who can simultaneously be creative, critical and reflective thinkers.





MYP CURRICULUM

Current junior students at the International School Altdorf study several courses from six different groups of subjects, plus a program of sports centered on physical and health education. The list of groups and subjects will evolve according to students' needs and our progress in the curriculum authorization.

The Middle Years Programme is then completed by two core components (Personal Project, Service as Action). Students must also participate in other activities related to clubs, sports, creative and service activities – which complement the overall programme.

Cambridge International General Certificate of Secondary Education



The Cambridge International General Certificate of Secondary Education (IGCSE) is a two-year educational programme that we offer for students usually between 14 and 16 years old. The IGCSE qualification is recognized worldwide and serves as an ideal preparation for further studies and international qualifications.

Furthermore, the International General Certificate of Secondary Education is the world's most popular international qualification for young students. Not only is it truly international – it gives students more options than any other international qualification, allowing students more ways to learn and succeed

Academic Performance

The results of our students in the last two sessions of the Cambridge IGCSE exams has been excellent. With a pass rate of 97%, most students achieved high scores, with 37% obtaining A or A* in their individual exams. In addition to the Cambridge courses and exams, students participated to additional academic programs and activities to prepare for the senior graduating programs.

IGCSE CURRICULUM

Our International General Certificate of Secondary Education programme currently offers courses from 4 categories, although the options offered can be expanded in the future. These courses are taught by teachers who are experts in their respective fields and have an international level of experience.

At International School Altdorf, from 2022 the Cambridge IGCSE programme is integrated with our Middle Years Programme, thus students are required to take two language courses, one mathematics course, at least one humanities course and at least one experimental science course.

Students will learn to work and communicate in English as well as apply their knowledge to new and familiar situations. In addition to this IGCSE programme, students take part in additional courses, creative activities, sports and and personal projects to help them develop a broad set of academic and social skills.

Students can sit the Cambridge IGCSE in line to their preferences and priorities and according to their future programme of studies.

International School Altdorf is proud to share its list of universities and colleges that have accepted students from the IBDP who have a 100% pass rate. Our graduates perform very strongly in the UK where many offers were received from top institutions such as Imperial College London, University College London, University of St. Andrews, University of Edinburgh, King's College London.

Many students of ours increased their interest in U.S. universities and most received excellent offers, with some having the opportunity to join world-top institutions such as the University of California, where one student will join UC Davis and two students will join Berkeley.

We also saw an increased interest in universities around the globe with offers received from the University of Toronto and other institutions in Canada, the University of St. Gallen in Switzerland, and many offers from universities in Hong Kong and Australia, Singapore, and the Netherlands.

These results were outstanding for our young school, given that international competition becomes more intense every year, showing that the academic level of our school makes our students competitive to enter the best universities in the world.


Tamara Schornikow




